## **Tree Plantation Programme**

Date: 02.08.2019 to 04.08.2019

Organised by: NSS

**Programme Details:** On the auspicious occasion of Aranya Saptaha, it was decided that the NSS wing of the college will plant saplings in the college campus. An area of approximately 150 feet by 80 feet was identified in front of Boys' Hostel for plantation. The volunteers prepared the soil, collected manure for preparation of land. Saplings were collected from the Bodaganj Beat Nursery and Aranya Bhavan of Jalpaiguri. Dr. Tanmay Datta, Mr. Ershad Ali and Mr. Milanmoy Roy made arrangement for collection of these saplings. Nearly 200 saplings were planted including Indian Sal. Many enthusiastic teachers were actively engaged in plantation programme. **Corona Relief distribution Programme** 

Time: 11.04.2020 onwards

Organised by: NSS

Programme Details: Our NSS volunteers contributed to form a fund to help the needy people of the

locality. We made an appeal to the established ex-students to donate in that fund. NSS bank account

was shared among the willing people known to us. Consequently, about Rs. 30,000/- were deposited in

the fund. By this amount we formed 4 camps in different places of the district to help the poor people.

Beneficiaries were listed from the four sites. The four such sites are: (1) Netaji Para, Residential house

of NSS Programme Officer of Unit-II, organized by Milanmoy Roy, Sanjay Barman and Rahul Roy (2)

Garalbari headed by Ershad Ali and local NSS volunteers, (3) Pandapara Kalibari headed by Anuj Pratim

Dey (Ex-student), (4) Khattimari, Dhupguri headed by Abhishek Barman Pramanik. From these camps

food items were distributed. Subsequently, Sagar Prosad, a volunteer of the NSS Unit-II approached the

BDO, Nagrakata to help him to spread awareness among the tea garden people and planned to

distribute food items among the needy people. He worked hard for overall awareness of these simple

illiterate people. The BDO of Nagrakata helped him providing car, logistic support etc free of cost. He,

along with 3 of his fellow volunteers did substantial jobs there. It is important to mention that the

expenses of the relief works during corona lockdown period were totally met by the donations from

volunteers, not from the govt. sanctioned NSS fund.

Outcome: The imposition of a complete lockdown by the Indian government in March 2020 to prevent

a rise in COVID-19 infections has had a substantial impact on the country's economy and health. The

scenario was more acute than the national average in Dooars region. The tribal dominated tea gardens

in Jalpaiguri, the marginalized group of agricultural labourers and the migratory labourers of Jalpaiguri

district suffered significantly. Apart from individual initiatives by teaching and non teaching members of

the college, the college through NSS conducted this relief programme which immensely benefitted the

affected people. Nearly 150 households benefitted from these camps. With this relief distribution

programme, the students learnt their responsibility at the time of any national crisis.

Superintendent, Jalpaiguri Sadar Hospital deployed two house staffs, pharmacists on the specific day of our health check up camp in the garden. Pathological support was provided by an NGO deployed at the camp by the BMOH, Belakoba. Patients tested their blood samples, sugar, urine etc.

**Outcome:** The students not only made some contributions to providing medical assistance to the residents of the adopted village, but also made a successful attempt to involve and engage with the children in some joyous hours of games and sports and creative activities.

Programme details: The objective of the programme is to ceate awareness among children about the importance of plants in protecting the environment and how plantation can help protect the earth and nature.15 students of Department of botany, AC College, Jalpaiguri accompanied by teachers Prof Suman Sen, Dr. Pushpanjali Ray, Sri krishnendu Majhi and Smt Ankita Biswas visited Panda para junior basic school, a Government aided primary school for children of nearby poor neighborhood in the outskirts of Jalpaiguri.
