Semester- I

Major Paper - I (History of India – Prehistory and Protohistory)

The objectives of studying this paper are to trace the evolution of human civilization in the Indian subcontinent from different perspectives. Firstly, to explore the Paleolithic and Mesolithic periods by investigating early human settlements and adaptation to changing environments. Secondly, to understand Neolithic Revolution in focusing on the shift from hunting – gathering to food production. Thirdly, to analyze the advanced urban planning, architecture and socio-economic aspects of the Harappan Civilization.

Major Paper – II (History of India C. 1500 BCE to 300 BCE)

The objectives of studying this paper are to examine the socio-political dynamics of the Vedic period, investigating the formation and expansion of the Mahajanapadas and understanding the emergence of Early Republics in India. Additionally the focus is on exploring the teachings and impact of religious and philosophical movements like Jainism, Buddhism and Ajivikism in India.

Semester – II

Major Paper III (History of India, 300 BCE to 300 CE)

The aims of studying this paper are to analyze the Maurya and Post Maurya political structures, economic systems and cultural advancements in India. In addition the paper explores the trade routes and economic prosperity of contemporary India.

Major Paper IV (History of India, 300 CE to 750 CE)

The objectives of studying the history of India from 300 CE to 750 CE include examining the political, economic and cultural aspects of the Gupta and the Post Gupta Period in India. Along with this the paper throws light on trade and cultural exchanges of India with Southeast Asia and China during the period under study.

Semester – I

Minor Paper I (History of India, from earliest times up to 300 CE)

The paper tries to depict the picture of political, cultural and economic transformation in India during the period of Stone Age Culture to the Post Maurya Age. Side by side, the paper focuses on the impact of religious movements together with the development of administrative structure of India up to the Satavahana and Kushana rule. Furthermore, the students will get knowledge about the glorious Sangam Age especially its literary excellence.

Semester – II

Minor Paper II (History of India, from 300 CE to 1206 CE)

The objective of this paper is to make the students acquainted with the political, economic and administrative history of India roughly from the Gupta Period to the Pre – Sultanate Age. In addition, the paper aims to analyze the developments in the field of art, literature and science during this era in India. Moreover, the paper throws light on the impact of the Chola rule in South India and Muslim invasions in early medieval India.
