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JOURNEY OF ANANDA CHANDRA COLLEGE

The foundation of 'Ananda Chandra College' was laid in 1942. It was the year with

the turmoil of the Second World War and the Quit India Movement. Late Debendra Kumar Chandra and Late Tarani Mohan Chakraborty were the heart and soul behind this endeavour. The financial magnanimity of Late Nalini Kanta Rahut helped to fulfil this. Yet, the dream did not come true without hurdles. Calcutta University granted the affiliation in May 1942 to start I.A. (Intermediate in Arts) in seven subjects and I. Sc. (Intermediate in Science) in Mathematics. The classes began on the 1st day of October 1942 with

62 students in a small building. The building was on land donated by the Rahut family in the Race Course area. Undergraduate courses started in the college from 1945-46 session.

On 7th June 1956, the then Governor of the State of West Bengal, Honourable Late Dr H.C. Mukherjee laid the first stone of the new building of the college at the present

location. The college got shifted in its new premises in July 1959. The college came under the Government Sponsored Scheme from session 1956-57. It received recognition by the University Grants Commission under category 2(f) and 12(B) of the UGC Act in April 1956. It secured us the eligibility for getting generous financial help. After being affiliated with Calcutta University for a long twenty years, it got affiliated with the newly established University of North Bengal in

1962. After incessant perseverance, dedication and hard work by the Principals, teaching staff, administrative staff and the students alike, the college secured B++ Accreditation (First Cycle) by National Assessment and Accreditation Council (NAAC) on 16.09.2004.

This college accommodates nearly four thousand students. It is running 20 academic departments, comprising 9 Science subjects and 11 Humanities and Social Sciences. Besides, it also offers self-financed courses in Microbiology (B.Sc.), Mass Communication & journalism (B.A.) and Bengali (PG). The college also has study centres of Netaji Subhas Open University (NSOU) and Burdwan University (Distance Education Mode). These cater to those students who cannot get admission in the regular courses.

One cannot forget the contributions of the non-teaching staff and the ministerial staff of the college in its uplift. They have proved themselves to be the backbone and vital support for enriching the intellectual excellence of the college. The success of the college mentioned above is our strength despite certain infrastructural and personnel limitations. Despite this, we have ample opportunities to improve upon it.

Finally, we remember and dedicate this effort to all those who were once a part of this college but are no more with us. May all their souls rest in peace.

COURSES OF STUDIES

Ananda Chandra College is a co-educational institution and runs B.A. & B.Sc. HONOURS course and B.A. & B.Sc. PROGRAM course under CHOICE BASED CREDIT SYSTEM (CBCS). It also carries on self-financing P.G. Course in Bengali and U.G. Course in Mass Communication and Journalism. "Undergraduate Course of Study" means a Three-Year Course of study divided into Six Semesters. A student will have to study the following Courses during three years of under graduation:

- 1. Discipline Specific Core (CC/DSC) Course: Its aim is to cover the basics that a student is expected to imbibe in a particular discipline.
- 2. Discipline Specific Elective (DSE) Course: Its aim is to provide a student with specific or specialized or advanced or supportive knowledge associated with the main discipline/subject of study.
- 3. Generic Elective (GE) course: Its aim is to enable a student to gain exposure or extended knowledge to some other discipline/subject beyond the choices a student makes as DSC and DSE Courses.
- 4. Skill Enhancement Courses (SEC): They provide value-based and/or skill-based knowledge and contain both theory and laboratory/hands on training/field work. The purpose is to increase the employability of a student.
- 5. Ability Enhancement Compulsory Course (AECC): They lead to knowledge enhancement of a student and include Environmental Science and English/MIL Communication.
- 6. Language Core Courses (LCC): These are meant only for students of B.A. Program. The purpose is to improve command over language of a student and include MIL and English.
- 7. Practicals/ Tutorials (One each with every DSC, DSE, & GE Courses): Practical means laboratory or field exercises in which a student has to do experiments or other practical work of two hour duration. Tutorial means special instructions based on lectures.

Evaluation, Credit, & Attendance

1. Each Paper consists of 75 marks except AECC-1 & AECC-2. The marks calculation of Laboratory based Papers are:

Theory=40; Practical=20; Internal Assessment=10 & Attendance=5.

The marks calculation of Non- Laboratory based subjects are:

Theory=60; Internal Assessment=10 & Attendance=5.

- 2. AECC-1 consists of 100 marks Paper (Theory=80; Internal Assessment=15 & Attendance=5) and AECC-2 consists of 50 marks Paper (Theory=35; Internal Assessment=10 & Attendance=5).
- 3. All Papers have 6 credits each except AECC and SEC Papers which have 2 credits each.
- 4. MIL (Major Indian Language) comprises Bengali/English/Hindi/Sanskrit.
- 5. LCC-1 (Language Core Course 1) comprises Bengali/Hindi/Sanskrit.
- 6. Internal Assessment Students should complete internal assessments before appearing at the respective semester examination and the marks obtained will be carried over in case students fail to pass the course(s). All the internal continuous evaluations shall be conducted by the teachers of the department. It has to be on the basis of Term Papers, Reports, Seminars Presentations, Class Tests, Field Work or any combination thereof spread over the entire period of study. There will be no scope of re-appearing in internal assessment examination for improvement of marks. Marks awarded in internal assessment will be credited to a candidate"s performance in subsequent chances.
- 7. Attendance No student shall be allowed to take the end semester written examination if the student has not attended 75% of the classes held in the Course concerned. Marks will be awarded for attendance in the following manner:
 - i. Attendance of 75% or above but below 80% 02 marks
 - ii. Attendance of 80% or above but below 85% 03 marks
 - iii. Attendance of 85% or above but below 90% 04 marks

- iv. Attendance of 90% or above 05 marks
- 8. To secure qualifying grade in a Course/Semester, a student has to secure the minimum qualifying percentage in the Written (including Practical) Examination and the Internal Assessment taken together. The qualifying marks for each course shall be 40% in each course of a semester taken together of internal assessment and term end exams. If a student fails to secure qualifying grade in a particular course his/her result of the concerned semester-end examination will be declared SNC (Semester Not Cleared).
- 9. A student failing to pass in one or more course(s) in 1st/2nd Semester Examination shall be permitted to re-appear in that course(s) in respective semester examinations of the following year as 2nd chance. A student will be permitted to clear his/her failed course(s) in maximum three consecutive chances irrespective of availing/not availing any particular chance. If a student wishes to skip examination in a semester, or surrender her/his result of a particular Semester-end examination, it would be included within the stipulated three chances. These students will be eligible to clear those course(s) in the respective Semester Examinations of subsequent years (i.e. 1st Semester with the 1st Semester of the subsequent year, 2nd Semester with the 2nd Semester of the subsequent year and so on.
- 10. In the Semester system, there would be automatic promotion right from the first Semester, till the sixth Semester, irrespective of the marks obtained in the previous Semesters subject to the fact that the eligibility conditions for appearing in the examination are satisfied.
- 11. If a newly admitted student to the 1st Semester remains absent for more than 15 days continuously without any intimation, his/her admission will stand cancelled.

B) Ability Enhancement Compulsory Course -1 (AECC-1), i.e., ENVS is common for all students.

AECC-2 has to be chosen from Modern Indian Languages (MIL): Bengali/ English/ Hindi/ Sanskrit.

Rules Regarding Choice of Subjects

- 1. A candidate shall be allowed to take up Sociology and Education Honours and Program subject if passed in History, Philosophy and Political Science in previous qualifying examination.
- 2. A candidate shall be allowed to take Physics subject if passed in Mathematics and Chemistry along with Physics and other subject at the previous qualifying examination.
- 3. A candidate shall be allowed to take Chemistry subject if passed in Mathematics and Physics along with Chemistry and other subject at the previous qualifying examination.
- 4. A candidate shall be allowed to take Botany/Zoology if passed in Biology at the previous qualifying examination.
- 5. A candidate shall be allowed to take Physiology Honours and Program Course if passed in Biology and Chemistry at the previous qualifying examination.
- 6. A candidate shall be allowed to take Computer Science Honours and Program Course if passed in Mathematics at the previous qualifying examination.
- 7. A candidate shall be allowed to take Microbiology Honours if passed in Chemistry and Biology at the previous qualifying examination.
- 8. A candidate shall be allowed to take Geography Honours if passed in Geography at the previous qualifying examination.
- 9. A candidate shall be allowed to take Economics Honours if passed in Mathematics or Business Economics including Business Mathematics at the previous qualifying examination.
- 10. No student of Honours in Arts other than that of Geography and Economics shall be allowed to take Science subjects as Generic Elective (GE) subjects.
- 11. A candidate pursuing Honours Program in a subject shall not be allowed to take up the same subject as Generic Elective (GE) subject.
- 12. A candidate pursuing Honours Course in a Language subject shall not be allowed to take another Language subject as Generic Elective (GE) subject.
- 13. Students willing to take Physical Education as a subject shall be required to go through a physical admission test for selection. Due importance should be given to the candidates who have successfully participated in the State level meet or above.

14. Change of subject and change from Honours Course to Program Course and viceversa shall not be allowed after filling up the registration form.

Elligibility Criteria for Admission

- 1. A student shall be allowed to take admission in the HONOURS COURSE and PROGRAM COURSE of B.A./B.Sc. if he/she/transgender has passed in at least four (04) subjects excluding Environmental Studies with English as compulsory subject in Higher Secondary (10+2) Examination held by West Bengal Council of Higher Secondary Education or any other examination which is recognized by the University as equivalent thereto.
- 2. Provided that a candidate who has obtained (a) 55% marks in aggregate or (b) 50% marks in aggregate with 60% marks in a subject in the last qualifying examination shall be eligible to apply for Honours course in that subject. Admission shall, however, be on merit and availability of seats.
- 3. It may be noted that in matter of eligibility 49.5% and above shall be equal to 50%; 54.5% and above shall be equal to 55%; and 59.5% marks and above shall be equal to 60%.
- 4. With regard to SC/ST candidates, the minimum marks of eligibility shall be as per rules of the State Government. An SC/ST candidate getting admission should have obtained in the previous examination, qualifying marks not lower by more than **25%** of the marks obtained by the last candidate of the general category.
- 5. With regard to OBC-A/OBC-B candidates, the minimum marks of eligibility shall be as per rules of the State Government. An OBC-A/OBC-B candidate getting admission should have obtained in the previous examination, qualifying marks not lower by more than **10%** of the marks obtained by the last candidate of the general category.
- 6. As per the rules of the State Government SC/ST candidates migrating from other states will be treated as general candidates.
- A candidate shall be allowed to pursue B.A./B.Sc. Program Course if he/she/transgender has passed the qualifying examination in Vocational Stream subjects.
- 8. For admission to the Under Graduate Course there should not be a gap of more than 3 years between the year of Higher Secondary Examination and the year of admission to Under Graduate Course of study
- 9. Candidates may note that the admission to any Course is provisional. If a candidate fails to fulfill the eligibility criteria laid down by the University of North Bengal, the admission shall stand cancelled at any stage.
- 10. The followings are the criteria for the preparation of the Merit Panel in **Honours Course**:
 - i. **Merit = (E + S + T2)/4** for candidates who have applied in those Honours Program Course Subject which the candidates studied in the previous qualifying examination. (where S = Marks in the subject opted for Honours; E = Marks in English; T2 = Best Marks of other two subjects excluding Environmental Science)
 - ii. **Merit = (E + T3)/4** for candidates who did not have subject opted for Honours Program Course in his / her previous qualifying examination. (where E = Marks in English; T3 = Best Marks of other three Subjects Excluding EVS).
- 11. The followings is the criteria for the preparation of the Merit Panel in **Program Course**:
 - i. **Merit = (E + T3)/4** (where E = Marks in English; T3 = Best Marks of other three Subjects Excluding EVS).
- 12. Those students who have credentials in sports and games shall be given due weightage in the admission to UG Courses. Those sports and games shall be considered for weightage which are affiliated to Sports Board, University of North Bengal.
 - i. The following sports and games shall be considered for weightage:

- a. Athletics (Men and Women)
- b. Badminton (Men and Women)
- c. Cricket (Men)
- d. Football (Men)
- e. Handball (Men and Women)

- f. Kho-Kho (Men and Women)
- g. Kabaddi (Men and women)
- h. Table Tennis (Men and women)
- i. Volleyball (Men)
- ii. The categories of students who shall be considered for such weightage are as follows:
 - a. Position Holder at State Level Competition;
 - b. Participation at National level Competition;
 - c. Position Holder at National Level Competition;
 - d. Participation at International level Competition; and
 - e. Position Holder at International level Competition.

NOTE: Weightage shall be given to students if he/she has participated or held position at International Level Competition in any games and sports.

Important Note

- For candidates under the SC/ST category, SC/ST certificates (valid for West Bengal) must be obtained from the competent authority in the name of the candidate.
- For candidates under the Permanent Disabled Reserved Category, Permanent Disability Certificate must be obtained from the Civil Surgeon/District Medical Officer.
- Attested copies of Certificates are required to be produced at the time of admission.
- At the time of enrolment, a candidate has to submit two copies of recent unattested stamp size (4.6 cm x 4.6 cm) photographs and the original Mark-sheet.
- Candidates from boards other than WBCHSE (any examining body outside the West Bengal) must submit a Migration Certificate from the competent authority.
- All subsequent Notifications, Counseling Schedules, Admission Instructions, Merit Panel, etc. will be uploaded on the College Website and put up in the College Notice Board.
- Contact Office of the Principal for any further query, such as, admission on transfer, method of computation of SGPA & CGPA, rules regarding reassessment & scrutiny, disciplinary rules during examination, provisional result & Grade Card, etc.

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CENTRAL LIBRARY

The Central Library holds a unique position in Ananda Chandra College. It caters to the need of the undergraduate and post graduate students, research scholars and the faculty. It is a main source of knowledge, which is an integral and important part of our institute of higher learning. The library aims to collect all the books and periodicals so as to fulfill the need of the students and faculties are expected to read and enrich their literary strength. It provides a full range of high quality service based on both print and electronic media to students, teachers, non-teaching staff of Ananda Chandra College and external readers from other institutions. The computerization of the library has been done using SOUL 2.0 Software (Software for University Libraries) and services like acquisition, searching and lending are all automated.

Collections

The Central Library serves a wide range of information resources with various formats. Books and other library collections are shelved according to the Dewey Decimal Classification Scheme. All information materials and their locations are reflected in the card catalogue/ cardex on the 1st floor of the building. Presently, it has a collection of about 43,400 books (including reference books). Besides, it subscribes six journals, five periodicals and six newspapers. More importantly, it is also a subscriber of UGC-INFLIBNET N-LIST programme which is a boon for students, researchers and teachers alike.

Services & Facilities

- A student of Honours Course can borrow 2 books at a time for a period of 15 days. Students studying in General Course can borrow only 1 book at a time for a period of 15 days. Students pursuing M.A. Course are allowed to borrow 4 books at a time for a period of 15 days. Besides, textbooks, a student can also take books related to different competitive examinations like SSC, UPSC, NET/SET, etc.
- 2 Current issues of journals and periodicals are made available to the students and faculty members in the Reading Room. However, old journals are issued for a period of seven days.
- 3 New arrivals (books) are displayed on Display Stand for ten days.

- 4 The reference books are made available to the readers during library hours. Personal assistance and guidance are provided, if required.
- 5 Sets of university examination question papers are made available to faculty members and students from the library as well as from our website: www.accollege.in
- 6 College Library has started "Library Deposit Scheme" to provide an opportunity to off campus users to avail the facilities of library resources.
- 7 Wi-fi Internet facilities are provided to all the users of the College.
- 8 Study Room Facility is available to students and faculty members, during the library hours i.e. 6.30 am to 4.00 pm.
- 9 In addition to Central Library, several departments have their own Departmental Libraries where books are available for reading room purposes.

Rules for Students

- 1 Identity Card is compulsory for availing library facilities.
- 2 Identity Card will be issued by the Librarian on production of admission receipt and photograph.
- 3 No admission is permitted in study room without Identity Card.
- 4 Students can borrow books, journals, question paper sets on their Identity Card in the study room.
- 5 Constructive suggestions in the Suggestion Box are entertained.
- 6 In case of any grievances the users should contact Librarian or Principal.
- 7 Readers of the library may recommend resources for procurement.
- 8 Books / Study materials issued in the study room will have to be returned before leaving the study room, otherwise a fine of Rs. 10/- will be charged per day.
- 9 Indiscipline/ misbehaviour and misuse of Identity Card shall be liable for the disciplinary action.

Hostels

The college has separate hostels for male and female students of the college. The Boys' Hostel consists of a two storied building and a new single storied building. The Hostels are under Residential Superintendants who are the teachers of the College.

Rules and Regulations of the Hostels

- 3. No casual students will be allowed to stay as boarders in the Hostel after the publication of the University results.
- 4. Renewal fees for admission of old boarders need to be paid by filling an application form that is available with the Hostel Superintendant.
- 5. Fees may be changed at any time at the discretion of the authority.
- 6. No refund will be entertained in case of cancellation of admission to the College.

Canteen

A students' canteen has been running in the college premises since 2013. M/s Sanjib Bhowmick has been authorised to run it. The College Canteen has a carpet area of 60'X16'. There are two ANOs (Associated NCC Officers) in our College – (i) Capt. Parimal Bapari, Department of History and (ii) Capt. Bhusan Adhikary, Department of Physical Education. National Service Scheme (NSS)

National Service Scheme (NSS) was launched on 2nd day of October, 1969 under the Ministry of Youth Affairs and Sports with primary focus on the development of personality of students through community service. The activities of NSS include National Integration Camp, blood donation camps, plantation, immunisation, shramdan, disaster management and adventure programmes.

In our College, there are two units of NSS. Both the units are actively engaged in different kinds of social activities. It may be noted that students taking Physical Education as a subject, participation in NSS is compulsory. Other students interested in joining NSS may contact the respective Programme Officers of NSS Units. At present, NSS Unit-I and NSS Unit-II run under the supervision of Programme Officers Sri Gourango Chandra Roy, Department of History and Dr. Bipul Chandra Sarkar, Department of Geography respectively.

Session 2019-2020 saw several social welfare activities organized by both the Units either jointly or separately. Jointly, both the Units organized 'Special Health Camp' (16.02.2019) at Karala Valley Tea Garden; 'Tree Plantation Program (05.08.2019) in the College Campus; 'Free Eye Examination Camp' (13.08.2019) in the College Campus; and 'Cleaning Drive' (30.11.2019) in the College Campus. It is commendable work of NSS Unit-I when it conducted a seven day long 'Swachha Bharat Internship Camp' from 24th July to 30th July, 2019 where students were provided on ground training regarding organization of social welfare activities and awareness camps. Special credit goes to NSS Unit-II which displayed exemplary example when it organized 'Relief Distribution Camp' on 18.04.2020 where food items were distributed to underprivileged section of society.

Games & Sports

The College is endowed with one of the best infrastructure among the Colleges of North Bengal for development of sports & games. It has two large playgrounds with facilities like 400 mts. Track and playfields for Football, Cricket, Volleyball, Hockey, Kabaddi and Kho-Kho. Besides, we possess an enviable huge gymnasium (with carpet area more than 7200 sq. ft.) with badminton court, volleyball court, table tennis and Gymnastics. We also have 12 Station Multi Trainer and Weight Training Equipments.

College was awarded 'Champion of Champions' for four consecutive years 2009-10, 2010-11, 2011-12 and 2012-13 by the Sports Board, North Bengal University. We also hosted Inter-College Athletic Meet under University of North Bengal in the years 2013 (15th & 16th November); 2015 (1st & 2nd December) & 2017 (November). Besides, we organised Inter-College Volley Ball Tournament in 2016 (22nd & 23rd September). The sporting feats of the College continued unabated even during last session 2019-2020. The College became Champions in NBU Inter-College Tournament/Meet in Cricket, Badminton and Athletics.

Career Counselling

The College has a Career Counselling Cell which guides the students on job prospects and different competitive examinations. It regularly holds lecture sessions and workshops to aware students on time-management, useful competitive magazines and books.

Stipends, Scholarships, and Concessions

The College understands that several of its students face financial constraints. Thus, it offers 'Free/Half Free Studentship' on grounds of merit and means. Besides, the 'Government of India Post Matrics Scholarship' is available to SC/ST/OBC students and 'D.P.I. Stipends' to meritorious students. The College also has a 'Students' Aid Fund' to help obtain financial aid to those poor but meritorious students who do not fall under categories mentioned above. Further, a fee concession of 50% is given to students who represent College at National and International level in games and sports.

Grievance Redressal

The College has a 'Grievance Redressal Cell' headed by the Principal and assisted by the Bursar. It looks into the grievances of all persons related with the College and takes appropriate measures for quick and transparent redress. Students can drop their grievances in the Complaint Box placed outside the Academic Council.

Anti-Ragging

In conformity with the 'West Bengal Prohibition of Ragging in Educational Institution Act, 2000' and UGC notified, 'Regulations on Curbing the Menace of Ragging in Higher Educational Institutions, 2009', the College has prohibited abetment or propagation of 'ragging' in any form. 'Ragging' means doing of any act which causes, or is likely to cause any physical, psychological or physiological harm or apprehension or shame or embarrassment to a student. If a student is found guilty of abetment or propagation of 'ragging', he/she shall be expelled/rusticated/terminated from the College. A student has to sign a declaration in this regard at the time of admission.

Women's Cell

In conformity with UGC Guidelines, the College had set up this Cell in November, 2013. It is headed by the Principal and assisted by few women members of the teaching faculty and one woman representative from among the students. Since its inception, the Cell has been active not only in creating awareness among women about their rights and responsibilities and in assisting them in realising her strength and potential but also in convening various sensitization programmes like health awareness programme, awareness regarding laws ensuring security of women in a gender-bias society.

Students' Union

The members of the Students' Unions over the years have been quite active in various activities of College life. The Unions have been regularly organising Freshers' Welcome, Annual Social Programme, Annual Sports, Saraswati Puja, Foundation Day, Independence Day, Republic Day, World Environment Day, Teachers' day, and the like. The members of the union are elected by the students of the college in a democratic, free and fair election.
