JOURNEY OF ANANDA CHANDRA COLLEGE

The foundation of 'Ananda Chandra College' was laid in 1942. It was the year with the turmoil of

the Second World War and the Quit India Movement. Late Debendra Kumar Chandra and Late Tarani Mohan Chakraborty were the heart and soul behind this endeavour. The financial magnanimity of Late Nalini Kanta Rahut helped to fulfil this. Yet, the dream did not come true without hurdles. Calcutta University granted the affiliation in May 1942 to start I.A. (Intermediate in Arts) in seven subjects and I. Sc. (Intermediate in Science) in Mathematics. The classes began on the 1st day of October 1942 with 62 students in a small building. The building was on land donated by the Rahut family in the Race Course area. Undergraduate courses started in the college from 1945-46 session.

On 7th June 1956, the then Governor of the State of West Bengal, Honourable Late Dr H.C. Mukherjee laid the first stone of the new building of the college at the present location. The

college shifted to its new premises in July 1959. The college came under the Government Sponsored Scheme from session 1956-57. It received recognition by the University Grants Commission under category 2(f) and 12(B) of the UGC Act in April 1956. It secured us the eligibility for getting generous financial help. After being affiliated with Calcutta University for a long twenty years, it got affiliated with the newly established University of North Bengal in 1962. After incessant perseverance, dedication and hard work by the Principals, teaching staff, administrative staff and the students alike, the

college secured B++ Accreditation (First Cycle) by National Assessment and Accreditation Council (NAAC) on 16.09.2004.

This college accommodates nearly four thousand students. It is running 20 academic departments, comprising 9 Science subjects and 11 Humanities and Social Sciences. Besides, it also offers self-financed courses in Microbiology (B.Sc.), Mass Communication & Journalism (B.A.) and Bengali (PG). The college also has study centres of Netaji Subhas Open University (NSOU) and Burdwan University (Distance Education Mode). These cater to those students who cannot get admission in the regular courses.

One cannot forget the contributions of the non-teaching staff and the ministerial staff of the college in its uplift. They have proved themselves to be the backbone and vital support for

enriching the intellectual excellence of the college. The success of the college mentioned above is our strength despite certain infrastructural and personnel limitations. Despite this, we have ample opportunities to improve upon it.

Finally, we remember and dedicate this effort to all those who were once a part of this college but are no more with us. May all their souls rest in peace.

COURSES OF STUDIES

Ananda Chandra College is a co-educational institution and runs B.A. & B.Sc. 4-year Undergraduate Program (FYUGP) with Single Major Single Minor Courses and Three Discipline Specific (Multidisciplinary) Courses under the New Curriculum and Credit Framework (NCCF) 2024. It also carries on self-financing P.G. Course in Bengali.

"Undergraduate Course of Study" means

- i. A Certificate after completing 1 year (2 Semesters) of study in the chosen field.
- ii. A Diploma after 2 years (4 Semesters) of study in the chosen field.
- iii. A Bachelor Degree after 3 years (6 Semesters) Program of study in the chosen field.
- iv. A Bachelor Degree (with Honours/Honours with Research) after 4 year (8 Semesters)

A student will have to study the following Courses in FYUGP.:

- 1. One/two discipline specific core courses to be termed as Major courses.
- 2. Courses on a single subject to be termed as Minor courses.
- 3. Ability Enhancement Courses one Compulsory (a Language Core Course in English) and one to be chosen from one of the following: Alternative English or a Modern Indian Language (M.I.L.) chosen from the pool of subjects
- 4. Interdisciplinary Courses (IDC) Courses three in total
- 5. Value Added Courses (Environmental Education and one other course to be chosen from a pool of subjects)
- 6. Skill Enhancement Courses (three each from Major courses). These courses (three in number) may be chosen from a pool of courses designed to provide value-based and/or skill-based knowledge and should contain both theory and laboratory/hands-on training/field work.
- 7. Internship: A student will also have to undergo internship once either at the end of 2nd semester or at the end of 4th semester during Summer Vacations
- 8. Practicals/ Tutorials (One each with every Major & Minor courses): Practical means laboratory or field exercises in which a student has to do experiments or other practical work of two hour duration. Tutorial means special instructions based on lectures.

Evaluation, Credit, & Attendance

1. Each Major and Minor Paper consists of 75 marks each. The marks calculation of Laboratory based Papers are:

Theory=40; Practical=20; Internal Assessment=10 & Attendance=5.

The marks calculation of Non- Laboratory based subjects are:

Theory=60; Internal Assessment=10 & Attendance=5.

- 2. Each AEC paper will be of 75 marks each (Theory=60; Internal Assessment=10 & Attendance=5).
- 3. Each IDC papers will be of 50 marks each (Theory=35; Internal Assessment=10 & Attendance=5.).
- 4. Each VAC paper will be 75 marks each (Theory=60; Internal Assessment=10 & Attendance=5).
- 5. Each SEC paper will be of 50 marks each. These will be based on theory and laboratory/ field work/ industry visit etc.
- 6. Internship/ Apprenticeship will be of 50 marks each.
- 7. Internal Assessment Students should complete internal assessments before appearing at the respective semester examination and the marks obtained will be carried over in case students fail to pass the course(s). All the internal continuous evaluations shall be conducted by the teachers of the department. It has to be on the basis of Term Papers, Reports, Seminars Presentations, Class Tests, Field Work or any combination thereof spread over the entire period of study. There will be no scope of reappearing in the internal assessment examination for improvement of marks. Marks awarded in internal assessment will be credited to a candidate's performance in subsequent chances.
- 8. Attendance No student shall be allowed to take the end semester written examination if the student has not attended 75% of the classes held in the Course concerned. Marks will be awarded for attendance in the following manner:
 - i. Attendance of 75% or above but below 80% 02 marks
 - ii. Attendance of 80% or above but below 85% 03 marks
 - iii. Attendance of 85% or above but below 90% 04 marks
 - iv. Attendance of 90% or above 05 marks
- 9. The qualifying marks for each course/paper will be 40% in each semester taken together with internal assessment, semester end examinations and practical examinations (minimum 30% marks in the semester end theory examination, minimum 40% marks in practical examinations separately).
- 10. If a student fails to secure qualifying (pass) marks in one paper or more in a particular semester examination his/her result of semester examination will be declared as 'SNC' (i.e., Semester Not Cleared). The result of the 6th semester examination will be kept withheld unless a student clears all the five semesters within the stipulated span of five years and a revival chance. He/she/transgender would be declared to have passed the

3-year Bachelor's Degree in a discipline in the year in which he/she/transgender clears his/her six semesters. The result of 8th semester examination (Honours/Honours with Research) will be kept withheld unless a student clears the 4th year (7th & 8th semesters) within the stipulated span of seven years. He/she/transgender would be declared to have passed the 4-year Bachelor's Degree (Honours/Honours with Research) in a discipline in the year in which he/she/ transgender clears his/her eighth semester.

11. In the Semester system, there would be automatic promotion right from the first Semester, till the sixth Semester, irrespective of the marks obtained in the previous Semesters subject to the fact that the eligibility conditions for appearing in the examination are satisfied. A student has to clear all the six semesters to be promoted in the 7th semester and after completion of the 8th semester within a span of 7 years will be declared passed with Honours/Honours with Research.

12. <u>If a newly admitted student to the 1st Semester remains absent for more than 15 days continuously without any intimation, his/her admission will stand cancelled.</u>

13. The college adheres to the rules and regulations published by University of North Bengal from time to time. The students should consult the latest FYUGP regulations by University of North Bengal for details.

Rules Regarding Choice of Subjects

- 1. A candidate will be allowed to take up any subject except Computer Science, Microbiology, and such other interdisciplinary subjects in B.A./B.Sc. FYUG Program, if he/she/transgender has passed in the corresponding subject (s) at the Higher Secondary Examination (10+2) recognized as equivalent by the University.
- 2. A candidate will be allowed to take up Sociology or Psychology or Education or Mass Communication & Journalism or BBA or BCA or BBA (TAH) if he/she has passed in the previous qualifying examination of any stream.
- 3. A candidate will be allowed to take up Physics Subject if he/she/transgender has passed in Mathematics and Chemistry along with Physics and other subjects as prescribed at the qualifying examination.
- 4. A candidate will be allowed to take up Chemistry Subject if he/she/transgender has passed in Mathematics and Physics along with Chemistry and other subjects as prescribed at the qualifying examination.
- 5. A candidate will be allowed to take up Botany/Zoology/Physiology Subject if he/she/transgender has passed in Biology at the qualifying examination.
- 6. A candidate will be allowed to take up Computer Science Subject if he/she/ transgender has passed in Mathematics or Statistics at the qualifying examination.
- 7. A candidate will be allowed to take up Microbiology Subject if he/she/transgender has passed in Chemistry and Biology at the qualifying Examination.
- 8. A candidate will be allowed to take up Economics as if he/she/transgender has passed in Mathematics or Business Economics including Business Mathematics and other subjects as prescribed at the qualifying examination.
- 9. A candidate will be allowed to take up Geography subject if he/she/transgender has passed in Geography with other subjects at the qualifying examination.
- 10. No student other than those of Science stream and Economics/Geography of Arts stream will be allowed to take Science subjects as Minor Subjects.
- 11. No student of Arts and Commerce stream other than those of Geography and Economics will be allowed to take Science subjects as Minor Subjects.
- 12. Students willing to take Physical Education as a subject shall be required to go through a physical admission test for selection. Due importance should be given to the candidates who have successfully participated in the State level meet or above.
- 13. A candidate pursuing Major in a subject will not be allowed to take up the same subject as Minor.
- 14. While taking Major & Minor subjects, availability of the said subjects in the college will be taken into cognizance.
- 15. Change of subject shall not be allowed after filling up the registration form.

Eligibility Criteria for Admission

1. A student will be allowed to take admission in the Single Major Single Minor Course of B.A./B.Sc. if he/she/transgender has passed in at least four (04) subjects with English as compulsory subject in the Higher Secondary [10+2] Examination held by the West Bengal Council of Higher Secondary Education or any other Examination which is recognized by the University as equivalent thereto.

- 2. Provided that a candidate who has obtained- (a) 55% marks in the aggregate, or (b) 50% in the aggregate with 60% marks in a subject / related subject in the last qualifying Examination shall be eligible to apply for Single Major and Single Minor course in that subject.
- 3. Admission shall however be on merit and availability of seats.
- 4. Provided that for SC/ST/OBC-A/OBC-B candidates- the minimum marks for eligibility shall be as per Rules of the State Government. An SC/ST candidate getting admission should have obtained in the previous examination, qualifying marks not lower by more than 25% of the marks obtained by the last candidate of the general category. An OBC-A/OBC-B candidate getting admission should have obtained in the previous examination, qualifying marks not lower by more than 10% of the marks obtained by the last candidate of the general category.
- 5. Provided further that in matter of eligibility 54.5% marks or above shall be equal to 55%, 49.5% and above shall be equal to 50% and 59.5 marks or above shall be equal to 60%.
- 6. As per the rules of the State Government SC/ST/OBC candidates migrating from other states will be treated as general candidates.
- 7. A student shall be allowed to take admission in the Multidisciplinary Course of B.A. /B.Sc. if he/ she has passed in at least four (04) subjects with English as compulsory subject in the Higher Secondary [10+2] Examination held by the West Bengal Council of Higher Secondary Education or any other Examination which is recognized by the University as equivalent thereto.
- 8. A candidate shall be allowed to pursue B.A. / B. Sc. Multidisciplinary Course if he/ she has passed the qualifying Examination in Vocational Stream subjects. Such students shall have the option to study up to the end of 6th semester.
- 9. For admission to the Undergraduate Program there should not be a gap of more than 3 years between the year of Higher Secondary Examination and the year of admission to the Undergraduate Program of study.
- 10. <u>Candidates may note that the admission to any Course is provisional. If a candidate fails to fulfil the eligibility criteria laid down by the University of North Bengal, the admission shall stand cancelled at any stage.</u>
- 11. The followings are the criteria for the preparation of the Merit Index in Single Major Single Minor Course:
 - i. Merit = (Marks obtained in Major/ related subject + Marks obtained in English + Best marks obtained in other two subjects) / 4 for candidates who have applied in that Major course which the candidates have studied in the previous qualifying examination.
 - ii. Merit = (Marks obtained in English + Best marks obtained in other three subjects) / 4 for candidates who did not have the subject opted for the Major Course in his / her previous qualifying examination.
- 12. The following is the criteria for the preparation of the Merit Index in Three Discipline specific Multidisciplinary Course:
 - i. Merit = (Marks obtained in English + Best marks obtained in other three subjects) / 4.

Important Note

- For candidates under the SC/ST/OBC category, SC/ST/OBC certificates (valid for West Bengal) must be obtained from the competent authority in the name of the candidate.
- For candidates under the EWS category, Income and Asset Certificate must be obtained from the competent authority for the current financial year (2024-25) in the name of the candidate.
- For candidates under the Permanent Disabled Reserved Category, Permanent Disability Certificate must be obtained from the Civil Surgeon/District Medical Officer.
- Original and Attested copies of Certificates are required to be produced at the time of admission.
- At the time of enrolment, a candidate has to submit two copies of recent unattested stamp size (4.6 cm x 4.6 cm) photographs and the original Mark-sheet.
- Candidates from boards other than WBCHSE (any examining body outside West Bengal) must submit a Migration Certificate from the competent authority.
- All subsequent Notifications, Counselling Schedules, Admission Instructions, Merit Panel, etc. will be uploaded on the College Website and put up in the College Notice Board.
- Contact Office of the Principal for any further query, such as, admission on transfer, method of computation of SGPA & CGPA, rules regarding reassessment & scrutiny, disciplinary rules during examination, provisional result & Grade Card, etc.

CENTRAL LIBRARY

The <u>Central Library</u> holds a unique position in Ananda Chandra College. It caters to the needs of the undergraduate and postgraduate students, research scholars and the faculty. It is a main source of knowledge, which is an integral and important part of our institute of higher learning. The library aims to collect all the books and periodicals so as to fulfil the need of the students and faculties are expected to read and enrich their literary strength. It provides a full range of high quality service based on both print and electronic media to students, teachers, non-teaching staff of Ananda Chandra College and external readers from other institutions. The computerization of the library has been done using SOUL 2.0 Software (Software for University Libraries) and services like acquisition, searching and lending are all automated.

Collections

The Central Library serves a wide range of information resources with various formats. Books and other library collections are shelved according to the Dewey Decimal Classification Scheme. All information materials and their locations are reflected in the card catalogue/ cardex on the 1st floor of the building. Presently, it has a collection of about 45,680 books (including reference books). Besides, it subscribes to six journals, five periodicals and six newspapers. More importantly, it is also a subscriber of UGC-INFLIBNET N-LIST programme which is a boon for students, researchers and teachers alike.

Services & Facilities

- A student of Single Major Single Minor Course can borrow 2 books at a time for a period of 15 days. Students studying in the Multidisciplinary Course can borrow only 1 book at a time for a period of 15 days. Students pursuing the M.A. courses are allowed to borrow 4 books at a time for a period of 15 days. Besides textbooks, a student can also take books related to different competitive examinations like SSC, UPSC, NET/SET, etc.
- 2. Current issues of journals and periodicals are made available to the students and faculty members in the Reading Room. However, old journals are issued for a period of seven days.
- 3. New arrivals (books) are displayed on Display Stand for ten days.
- 4. The reference books are made available to the readers during library hours. Personal assistance and guidance are provided, if required.

- 5. Sets of university examination question papers are made available to faculty members and students from the library as well as from our website: https://accollege-opac.kohacloud.in/
- 6. College Library has started "Library Deposit Scheme" to provide an opportunity to off campus users to avail the facilities of library resources.
- 7. Wi-fi Internet facilities are provided to all the users of the College.
- 8. Study Room Facility is available to students and faculty members, during the library hours i.e. 6.30 am to 4.00 pm.
- 9. In addition to the Central Library, several departments have their own Departmental Libraries where books are available for reading room purposes.

Rules for Students

- 1. Identity Card is compulsory for availing of library facilities.
- 2. Identity Cards will be issued by the Librarian on production of admission receipt and photograph.
- 3. No admission is permitted in the study room without an Identity Card.
- 4. Students can borrow books, journals, question paper sets on their Identity Card in the study room.
- 5. Constructive suggestions in the Suggestion Box are entertained.
- 6. In case of any grievances the users should use the grievance redressal box (online/offline) or contact the Librarian or Principal.
- 7. Readers of the library may recommend resources for procurement.
- 8. Books / Study materials issued in the study room will have to be returned before leaving the study room, otherwise a fine of Rs. 10/- will be charged per day.
- 9. Indiscipline/ misbehaviour and misuse of Identity Card shall be liable for the disciplinary action.

STUDENTS' FACILITIES & ACTIVITIES

Hostels

The college has separate <u>hostels</u> for male and female students of the college. The Boys' Hostel consists of a two storied building and a new single storied building. The hostel can accommodate 80 outstation male students of the college. The College also boasts a modern three-storied Girls' Hostel with a capacity for accommodating 110 female students. The Hostels are under Residential Superintendents who are the teachers of the College.



Rules and Regulations of the Hostels

- 1. Application for Hostel accommodation shall be submitted separately along with the application for admission at the College Office.
- 2. Admission to Hostel is for one session at the first instance.
- 3. No casual students will be allowed to stay as boarders in the Hostel after the publication of the University results.
- 4. Renewal fees for admission of old borders need to be paid by filling an application form that is available with the Hostel Superintendent.
- 5. Fees may be changed at any time at the discretion of the authority.
- 6. No refund will be entertained in case of cancellation of admission to the College.
- 7. For further details, contact respective Superintendents.

Canteen

A students' canteen has been running in the college premises since 2013. M/s Sanjib Bhowmick has been authorised to run it. The College Canteen has a carpet area of 60'X16'. Members of the Canteen Committee make surprise visits to the Canteen to ensure hygiene is maintained. The committee also carries out periodical surveys of students on their opinion regarding food quality, physical ambience, behaviour of staff, etc.

National Cadet Corps (NCC)

The National Cadet Corps (NCC) is the 'biggest volunteer youth organisation of the world with the MOTTO – 'Unity and Discipline'. It was established on 15th July, 1948 on the recommendation of the Justice Kunjru Committee to cultivate the ideas of discipline, patriotism and good and responsible citizenship Among the youths of schools and colleges at the national level. Immediately after the establishment of the NCC in the National level,

A.C College initially raised a subunit of the NCC under the stewardship of 2/Lt. B. Das Shastri. However, it could not run due to some unavoidable circumstances and as a result it was suspended in the year 1950. Again it was permanently revived in 1955 under the joint initiative of Lt B. Das Shastri, 2/Lt A.B. Majumder and 2/Lt S Das. Since then, NCC Sub-Unit became an integral part of A. C. College and has been playing a commendable role in various activities. From the inception of the A.C. College NCC Sub-Unit, 13 teachers/Officers (including present two) commanded the College Sub-Unit as Associate NCC Officer (ANO).

At present, <u>NCC sub-units</u> of A.C.College is under 61 Bengal BN NCC with Darjeeling Group of West Bengal and Sikkim Directorate. It has two Coys of the Army Wing. Since 2005, both boys and girls have been part of NCC Cadets. Many cadets of our College have secured jobs in the military, para military and other organisations.

Our NCC units are involved in 3 activities – (i) Core (Republic Day, Independence Day and Sports Day); (ii) Social (Tree Plantation, Blood Donation, AIDS Rally, Aid to Civil Authority); and Other (Cycle Rally). There are two ANOs (Associated NCC Officers) in our College – (i) Capt. Parimal Bapari, Department of History and (ii) Capt. Bhusan Adhikary, Department of Physical Education. Students willing to join NCC can contact them.

National Service Scheme (NSS)

The National Service Scheme (NSS) is a voluntary organisation in social services run by the Ministry of Youth Affairs & Sports, Government of India. National Service Scheme (NSS) was launched during 1969, the birth centenary year of Mahatma Gandhi, in 37 universities involving 40000 students. It provides opportunity to the student youth of 11th & 12th Class of schools at +2 Board level and student youth of Technical Institution, Graduate & Post Graduate at colleges and University level of India to take part in various government led community service activities & programmes. The sole aim of the NSS is to provide hands-on experience to young students in delivering community service.

Aims and Objectives

- To understand the community in which they work;
- To identify the needs and problems of the community and involve them in the problem solving process.
- To develop among themselves a sense of social and civic responsibility;
- To develop competence required for group-living and sharing of responsibilities:
- To gain skills in mobilising community participation;
- To acquire leadership qualities and democratic attitude;
- To develop capacity to meet emergencies and natural disasters; and
- To practise national integration and social harmony.

Enrollment in NSS

The NSS volunteers will be enrolled from the first and second year degree-class students. NCC cadets will not be allowed to join NSS. Similarly NSS volunteers will not participate in NCC or any other youth organisation as long as they are in NSS. An NSS volunteer needs to devote a total of 240 hours of social service in two years. Every year, a NSS volunteer has to devote 20 hrs. of orientation and 100 hrs. of community service. To enrol as an NSS volunteer, students have to contact the NSS Programme Officer of the college. Enrollment in NSS is free. The NSS volunteers on successful completion of the required hours of service are issued a certificate. NSS volunteers can get some weightage during admissions in higher studies and other benefits as decided by the institution/ university.

Administrative Structure in NSS

The unit at school/ college level is the grass-root unit in NSS. A Programme Officer is the incharge of a NSS unit who is the teaching faculty of a college appointed by the Governing Body. The strength of a unit is 100 NSS volunteers normally. According to the strength of students the number of units will be allotted by the Programme Coordinator at University level. All the units of all affiliated colleges of a university are controlled by Programme Coordinator appointed by the University. At the state level there is a State NSS Officer. At the regional level there is the NSS Regional Directorate. A Programme Officer will be responsible for the organisation of the NSS unit, implementation of the NSS programme under the supervision and direction of the Principal of the college or head of the institution. In our College, there are two units of NSS. Both the units are actively engaged in different kinds of social activities. It may be noted that students taking Physical Education as a subject, participation in NSS is compulsory. Other students interested in joining NSS may contact the respective Programme Officers of NSS Units. At present, NSS Unit-I and NSS Unit-II run under the supervision of Programme Officers Sri Gourango Chandra Roy, Department of History and Sri Chiranjeet Kole, Department of Sanskrit respectively.

NSS Units I & II are actively engaged in campus cleaning initiatives. Regular clean-up drives were organised, involving students and faculty members to maintain a clean and hygienic environment within the college premises. Regular activities such as awareness campaigns, blood donation drives, and skill development workshops were also conducted by NSS Units. Volunteers actively participated in various community engagement activities, including awareness sessions, health camps, and educational programs. To ensure the well-being of students and staff, trained volunteers monitored vital signs, provided basic medical assistance, and promoted healthy habits among individuals. Continuing the commitment to environmental conservation, NSS units organised tree plantation drives within the college campus and surrounding areas. These efforts aimed to enhance greenery, mitigate environmental degradation, and promote biodiversity.

Games & Sports

The College is endowed with one of the best infrastructure among the Colleges of North Bengal for development of sports & games. It has two large playgrounds with facilities like 400 mts. Track and playfields for Football, Cricket, Volleyball, Hockey, Kabaddi and Kho-Kho. Besides, we possess an enviable huge gymnasium (with carpet area more than 7200 sq. ft.) with badminton court, volleyball court, table tennis and Gymnastics. We also have 12 Station Multi Trainer and Weight Training Equipments.

College was awarded 'Champion of Champions' for four consecutive years 2009-10, 2010-11, 2011-12 and 2012-13 by the Sports Board, North Bengal University. We also hosted the Inter-College Athletic Meet under University of North Bengal in the years 2013 (15th & 16th November); 2015 (1st & 2nd December) & 2017 (November). Besides, we organised the Inter-College Volleyball Tournament in 2016 (22nd & 23rd September). The sporting feats of the College continued unabated even during the session 2019-2020. The College became Champions in NBU Inter-College Tournament/Meet in Cricket, Badminton and Athletics.

Career Counselling

The College has a <u>Career Counselling Cell</u> which guides the students on job prospects and different competitive examinations. It regularly holds lecture sessions and workshops to aware students on time-management, useful competitive magazines and books.

Stipends, Scholarships, and Concessions

The College understands that several of its students face financial constraints. Apart from various governmental scholarships like Swami Vivekananda Merit-cum-Means Scholarship, Kanyashree, Aikyashree, OASIS the college offers 'Free/Half Free Studentship' on grounds of merit and means. The College also has a 'Students' Aid Fund' to help obtain financial aid to those poor but meritorious students who do not fall under categories mentioned above. Further, a fee concession of 50% is given to students who represent College at National and International level in games and sports.

Grievance Redressal

The College has a 'Grievance Redressal Cell' headed by the Principal and composed of senior faculty members of the college. The <u>Grievance Redressal Cell</u> was constituted to look into the grievances and complaints of Students, Faculty and other Stakeholders within the campus. The Cell attempts to address all types of genuine grievances and complaints and aims to solve the grievances impartially and confidentially within a reasonable period of time. Students, faculty and all the stakeholders are encouraged to use the Grievance Box/Suggestion box as well as 'Online Grievance' available in the College website to place their grievances and suggestions. With the help of this platform the students can report their grievances on both academic and non-academic matters.

Anti-Ragging

In conformity with the 'West Bengal Prohibition of Ragging in Educational Institution Act, 2000' and UGC notified, 'Regulations on Curbing the Menace of Ragging in Higher Educational Institutions, 2009', the College has prohibited abetment or propagation of 'ragging' in any form. The College has been following a zero-tolerance policy towards ragging. 'Ragging' means doing any act which causes, or is likely to cause any physical, psychological or physiological harm or apprehension or shame or embarrassment to a student. If a student is found guilty of abetment or propagation of 'ragging', he/she shall be expelled/rusticated/terminated from the College. A student has to sign a declaration in this regard at the time of admission.

Ananda Chandra College, in conformity with Supreme Court and UGC guidelines has a functional Anti-Ragging committee. The Committee ensures strict enforcement of the designated rules regarding prevention of ragging not only in the academic campus but also in the Girls' and Boys' hostels. The vision of the committee is to build a ragging free environment by instilling the principles of democratic values, tolerance, empathy, compassion and sensitivity so that students become responsible future citizens. The committee arranges awareness and orientation programmes in the beginning of each academic session either centrally or departmentally. The Committee oversees the procedure of obtaining undertaking from the students in accordance with the provisions.


Students' Union

1. 2. The second performance was on 2nd September, 2022- This was a short skit by students of the Department of English, to commemorate the occasion of the Foundation Day of the college. The play tried to highlight the moral dilemmas of an ageing

professor who is finding it hard to cope with the pressures of online teaching, necessitated by the pandemic.

- 3 . *Chakrir Khonje*-The third performance was an adaptation of Bertolt Brecht's short story, The Job. It was performed as part of the International Working Women's Day Celebration of 2023, held on 15th February 2023. Students of Bengali and English departments had created the play, based on a script by Samik Dasgupta.
- 4. *Khudito Pashan, Chandalika and Streer Potro* -. This was a set of three short performances by participants in the add-on course, Drama-in-Practice. The performance happened on 12th May, 2023. 34 Students from English, Bengali, History, Geography, Political Science, Mass Communication and BA Program created these plays, under the supervision of eminent facilitators like Dr. Tamojit Roy, Dr. Apurba Kumar Saha, Dipankar Ray and Sabyasachi Dutta.
- 5. *Bijoy Ullash* A street theatre performance based on the Mahabharata, performed at the Shamyer Jonyo Natok festival, on 27th March (World Theatre Day), 2024.

Quiz Club

The Quiz Club of Ananda Chandra College was started by Arunoday Chaudhury (Department of History, Batch of 2018) and Arkabrata Chaudhury (Department of English, Batch of 2013). It had started with an inter-departmental quiz in 2019, but went into dormancy owing to the COVID 19 pandemic. It was reconvened again in September 2022, under the supervision of Arkabrata Chaudhury and Samik Dasgupta, Faculty of Department of English. Since then it has continuously held one monthly quiz event in college, along with special events like the Observance of Students' Week quiz in 2023 and 2024. One of the highlights of this quiz club is that alumni and veteran quizzers amongst the current students, conduct monthly quizzes as Quizmasters and gain the necessary training to present themselves in front of a larger audience. Members of the quiz club have represented the college successfully in the annual quiz

Film Club
